

# Browick Road Primary School's Sports Funding Report 2016-17

## What is the Sports Premium?

The government continues to contribute £150 million per annum for primary school sport. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health, and Culture, Media and Sport, with the money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years. Here at Browick Road that will mean we receive around £9,000 a year. Schools must spend the sports funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have the freedom to choose how they do this.

## Objective of Primary Sports Grant

At Browick Road we are strongly committed to PE. This is evident in the wide range of activities in and out of school that we offer, including being involved in competitive sports. As we are still in the process of changing from an Infant to a Primary School and therefore the nature of what we deliver has changed slightly to reflect this. We recognise the importance of PE to the health and well-being of our children and the impact the PE curriculum and extracurricular activities can have on the attitudes, confidence and academic achievement of all children.

## We are using our sports grant to:

- Ensure the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- Raise the profile of PE across the school
- Extend the leadership of our PE Coordinator to analyse the strengths and address the weaknesses of our PE provision
- Increase the participation of girls and boys in intra and interschool tournaments and competitions for KS1 and KS2
- Increase the participation of all children in sports clubs
- Improve the Physical Development element of EYFS curriculum
- Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Provide support from specialist sports coaches
- Create opportunities for gifted and talented children in sports to extend their skills at a higher level
- Extend the sports resources available
- Introduce new sports to children

Skipping ropes are available at playtime and lunchtime and have been used extensively.
Swimming teacher and pool-side assistant for Year 3 & 4	£350	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To ensure that we can provide KS2 Swimming curriculum</li> <li>• To allow children complete 25m</li> <li>• To allow children to take part in competitions</li> </ul>	This is the first year that the school has been able to offer swimming as part of its KS2 Curriculum. In future years funding for this will come from the main school budget. Children have indicated that swimming has been one of their favourite activities in KS2. Over 50% children in Y4 have already achieved their 25m award.

We hope to continue to run a club and to enter Hi Five competition next year.

The impact is still to be measured.
Transport to South Norfolk Gymnastic Competition	£65	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To allow children to take part in competitions</li> </ul>	Two teams were able to take part in the gym competition (8 children). This was a first cluster competition for many children. One team achieved 6 <sup>th</sup> Place and the other 9 <sup>th</sup> place. We will start practicing much earlier next year! And purchase kit.

Contribution to Outdoor Play Equipment EYFS	£5000 (total cost £32,000)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To extend the range of resources available so that more children can participate</li> <li>To improve PD scores in EYFS</li> <li>To improve behaviour in EYFS</li> </ul>	Children enjoyed new activities including large apparatus. They have practiced Real PE skills in their self-initiated play. PD scores involving moving and handling were not improved this year (2016 – 90% 2017 – 84%) however children often dropped points in the finer motor skills. This will be analysed again next year. The children were far more active, they had more space to move around and consequently there were no behavioural issues within the Reception Class this year.
