

# Browick Road Primary History Knowledge Organiser - Year 2 – Equal Rights

## Key Vocabulary

<b>Activist</b>	A person who campaigns for political or social change.
<b>Segregation</b>	Setting a group of people apart from others.
<b>Civil Rights</b>	That everyone should have equal opportunities: right to vote, education etc.
<b>Suffragettes</b>	Fought for women's right to vote.
<b>Boycott</b>	Stop doing or using something as part of a protest.
<b>Protest</b>	An action showing that you don't agree with something.
<b>Discrimination</b>	Treating someone differently because of their race, age, disability etc.

Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat to a white passenger on the bus. She was arrested and fined. As a result, African Americans in the region decided to boycott the bus service. The boycott last 381 days. As a result of the action, segregation on buses stopped.



Emmeline Pankhurst is a British activist and leader of the suffragette movement who helped women win the right to vote.

The suffragettes protested over **100** years ago!

Rosa Parks refused to move **65** years ago!

## Key changes and events

<b>1903</b>	Emmeline Pankhurst founds the WSPU.
<b>1905</b>	'Deeds not words' 'Votes for Women'
<b>1914</b>	WW1 begins and women take on traditionally male jobs.
<b>1928</b>	Women over 21 are given the vote!
<b>1955</b>	The Montgomery Bus Boycott begins.
<b>1957</b>	Desegregation of schools.
<b>1963</b>	Martin Luther King's 'I have a dream...' speech.
<b>2008</b>	Barack Obama is the first African American US President.
